COUNTERING FAKE NEWS: 2+2=4

Tête-à-tête with Canadian author Frédérick Lavoie

Frédérick Lavoie is an international freelance journalist and a nonfiction writer. As a reporter, he goes on the ground, gathers points of view, establishes facts and chronicles events. Then, as a writer, he transforms his investigations and travels into books, in which he recounts the complexities of the human experience in the face of turbulences of history. the long-lasting effects of the collapse of the Soviet empire, life on both sides of the frontline in war-torn Ukraine, the period of transition between two eras in Cuba and the strained relationship between India and Pakistan.

In this lecture, Lavoie will speak about his practice and discuss literary journalism as a tool of resistance to fake news, to alternative facts and to all those trying to make us believe that two and two make five.

Frédérick Lavoie was born in 1983 in Chicoutimi, Canada. Since 2008, he has been based in Moscow, Mumbai, Chicago and Montreal. He has reported from more than 30 countries for various Canadian and European media. He is the author of four nonfiction books, including for Want of a Fir Tree: Ukraine Undone (2018) and Before the After: Travels in Cuba with George Orwell (forthcoming in English), for which he received the Governor General's Literary Award for French Nonfiction in 2018. With his brother Jasmin, a former correspondent in Islamabad, he has also published Frères amis, frères ennemis, an epistolary exchange between India and Pakistan (2018). His next book will tell of the relationships of Bangladeshis with water. Frédérick Lavoie shares his time between Montreal, Mumbai and elsewhere.

Mommy is a 2014 Canadian drama film directed by Xavier Dolan and starring Anne Dorval, Antoine-Olivier Pilon, and Suzanne Clément. The story concerns a mother with a sometimes violent teenage son, struggling to control his behaviour in a hypothetical future in which parents have the legal option to commit troubled youth to public hospitals.

The story focuses on mother—son relationship, a reoccurring theme in Dolan's work, and also marks his fourth collaboration with Dorval and his third with Clément. Inspiration for this particular story was drawn from Dolan's discovery of Pilon and the music of Ludovico Einaudi. It was shot in Quebec in an unconventional aspect ratio.

The film debuted at the 2014 Cannes Film Festival, where it won the Jury Prize. It subsequently became a critical and financial success, grossing over \$13 million worldwide. Mommy went on to win numerous other awards, among them nine Canadian Screen Awards, including Best Motion Picture.

Through his exhibition, he will address the conflicts within the self as the artist navigates through violence, politics and cultural memory in a post globalized time through his exhibition.
